Onondaga Lake Partnership to host annual progress meeting

Syracuse, N.Y. – The Onondaga Lake Partnership (OLP) will conduct its Third Annual Progress Meeting on Thursday, Nov. 13 in the Broadway Bistro Room at the Art and Home Center on the New York State Fairgrounds in Syracuse. Exhibits will open at 6:30 p.m. and the meeting will begin at 7 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.

The meeting will include a “Year in Review” report from the OLP as well as reports from six groups that received Public Education and Outreach Mini-Grants to implement projects that benefit Onondaga Lake and its watershed. The evening will also feature exhibits from a variety of organizations with an interest in the restoration effort, an interactive question-and-answer period moderated by Matt Mulcahy of WTVH, and the announcement of winners of the OLP’s recent student essay and poster contests.
