Onondaga Lake Partnership to host annual progress meeting

Syracuse, N.Y. – The Onondaga Lake Partnership (OLP) will conduct its Fourth Annual Progress Meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 3 in the Martha Eddy Room in the Art and Home Center at the New York State Fairgrounds in Syracuse. Exhibits will open at 6:30 p.m. and the meeting will begin at 7 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.

The meeting will include a “Year in Review” video from the OLP as well as displays from seven groups that received Public Education and Outreach Mini-Grants to implement projects that benefit Onondaga Lake and its watershed. The evening will also feature exhibits from a variety of organizations with an interest in the restoration effort, an interactive question-and-answer period moderated by Matt Mulcahy of WTVH, and the announcement of winners of the OLP’s 2004 Photo Contest.
